

# Be a part of history on 13th July!

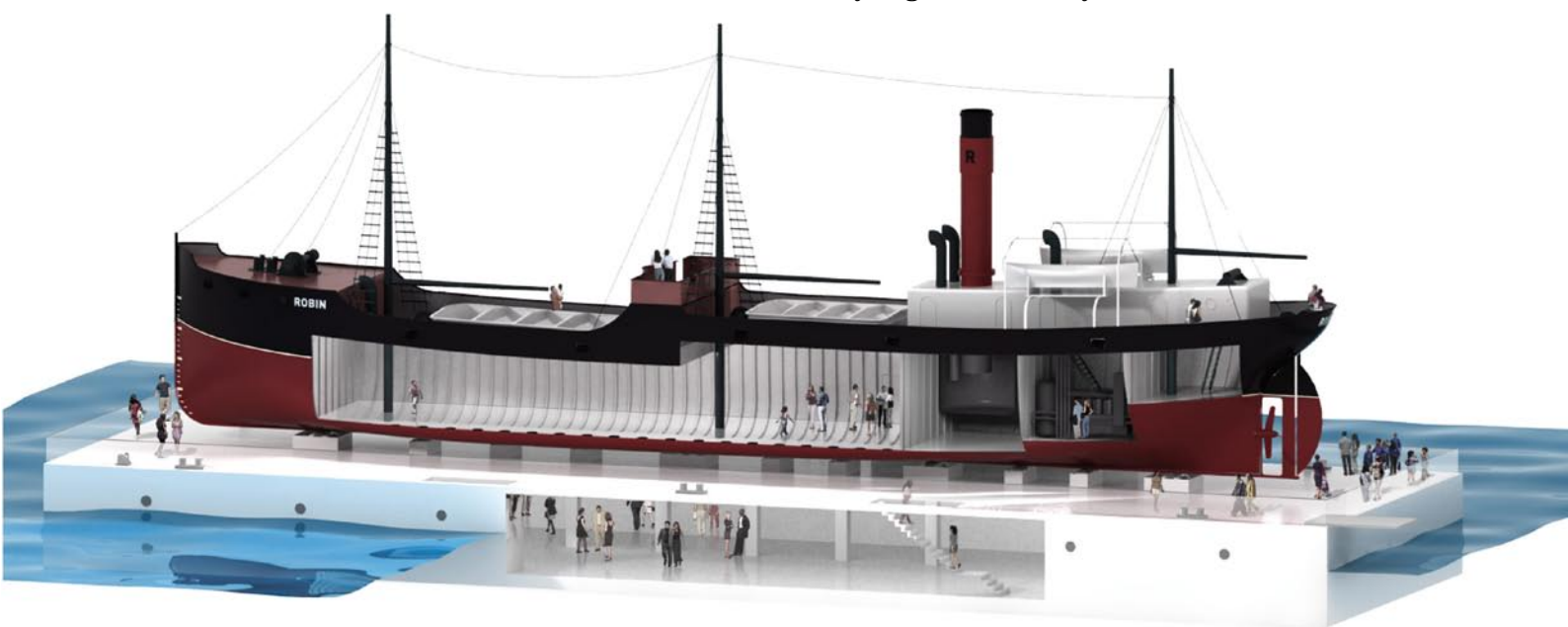
Come down to Royal Albert Dock to watch SS Robin - the world's last remaining steamcoaster - as she returns home to London's Royal Docks after 120 years.

SS Robin is one of London's secret treasures - and on July 13th you'll be able to discover her for yourself as she returns to the area where she was built in 1890. Make your way to Royal Albert Dock at 11am to be amongst the first Londoners to watch her arrive back to the East End - her first visit to the Royals for 120 years!

Now this precious and irreplaceable symbol of Britain's merchant navy is proudly displayed on a new floating pontoon, specially built to carry her. She's coming to the Royals to complete extensive conservation work to turn her in into a truly memorable new visitor attraction and learning centre for London.

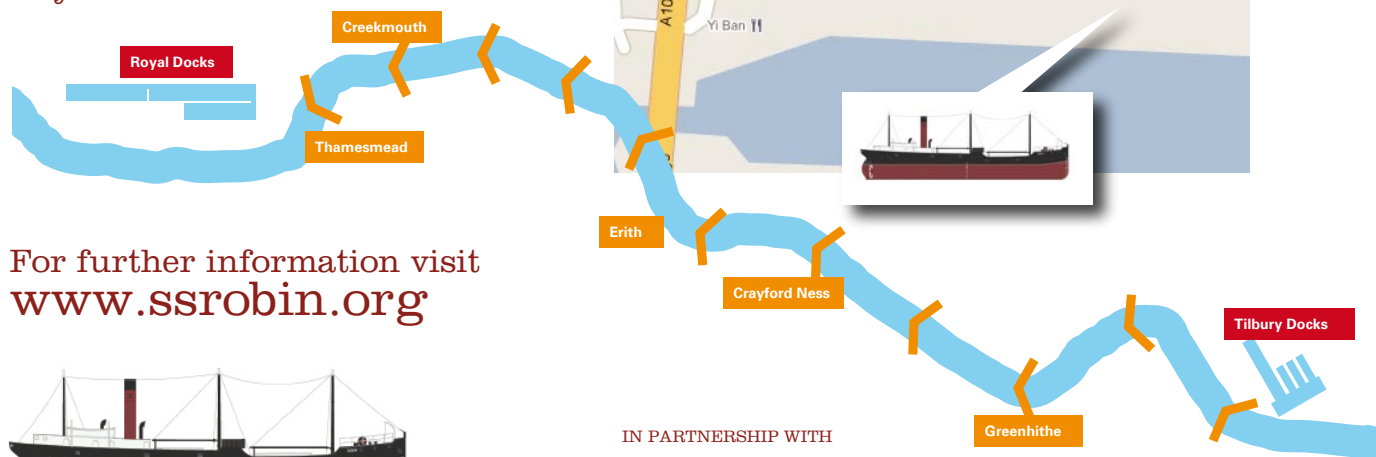
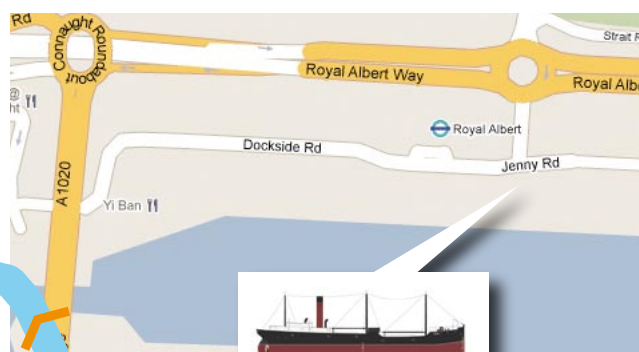
